Project Fund

Funds are available for student led collaborative projects responding to UAL’s 4 research themes.

- Regular awards of up to £300, deadline each term
- EXTRA awards of up to £1000, Spring term deadline.

Examples of funded projects:

On the Mend

A design collective led by MA students from CSM and LCC interested in healthcare and wellbeing environments.

Hollow Chambers

An exhibition of interdisciplinary work relating to notions around “caves” led by MA students from Wimbledon and CSM with the Mendip Caving group.

There and back again (2018 and 2019)

A two day event from Centre for Circular Design exploring the potential of design for end-of-life for products and materials through multiple perspectives. Led by Cathryn Hall and Laetitia Forst (PhD, Chelsea) with opportunities for MA students to present and report back.
